



Dues Are Not Enough


Fundraising is essential to provide the services and events we all enjoy.







CURRICULUM

Adaptable student curriculum designed specifically for the after school environment that delivers positive, fun, and engaging Jewish youth education through experiential education.

CAPITAL

Cohort II synagogues are eligible for up to \$100,000 in matching grants, to fund up to 50% of start up costs.




FY 25 Budget Overview








Revenue Trends










TOS Expenses








Expense Trends

Expense Trends by Category










Investment / Debt Trend

Clergy Nomination

The Board of Trustees has nominated Cantor Maayan Harel to be the next assistant clergy, effective July 1, 2024.

By-Laws Update

The Board of Trustees has recommended the by-laws be updated to remove non-functioning elements and to align process-based elements to reflect approx. 5 years of practice.

Update highlights:

- Removes the Advisor Council
- Allows for meetings to be held virtually
- Changes "Vice Presidents" to "Committee Chairs" and "Board of Managers" to "Board of Investment Managers"
- Streamlines notification process for meetings
- Reduces the number of members needed to form standing committees
